

## Sports Premium for Holy Cross and All Saints R.C. Primary School 2015-2016 What is Sports Premium?

The government are spending over £450 million on improving physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools over the 3 academic years 2013 to 2014, 2014 to 2015 and 2015 to 2016. Money goes directly to Primary Schools to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

At Holy Cross and All Saints we received £8,895 of funding.

## This year the funding was spent on:

- -Employing high quality sports coaches (One Goal) to provide stimulating sessions before and after school. This involved football and multi-sports activities.
- We had a 'Zorbing day' where the children had a unique experience.
- Transport to swimming lessons for Year 4





-Having an exercise day with 'Freddy Fit'. The children had lots of fun and developed their understanding on the importance of exercise.



-This last half term the Year 6 children have had taught Judo sessions.



- -Joining Salford's Sports Partnership. This supports teachers in developing their PE curriculum and provides competitive activities between schools.
- -School competitions (resources)

Various classes and children have had opportunities to take part in intra-school competitions, including swimming, rugby, and team games.







## What else do we do?

We feel strongly at Holy Cross and All Saints, that all children, whatever their needs should be given lots of opportunities and experiences to develop physically. Teachers plan and deliver various lessons which ensure progression in skills, alongside employing an outside agency to support this development. We provide swimming lessons all year to our Year 4 children. We have links with Salford Reds and Manchester United who deliver sporting sessions to a variety of year groups.

Each year our school subsidises Year 6 to visit Lledr Hall in North Wales which provides excellent opportunities for outdoor adventure and team building.

It is our aim to use future funding to continue the good practice we already have alongside improving the resources to facilitate this.



## Outcomes of the Sports Premium Funding 2015-16

- Increased the level of participation in extra curricular sports activities.
   KS1increase 42% KS2 increase 21%
- Increased children's awareness of healthy lifestyles and exercise.
- Provided opportunities for all Key Stage 2 pupils to participate in a school or inter school sports competition.( 120 pupils)
- Improved the delivery of PE lessons and expertise of PE Leader.
- Ensured all year 6 pupils attended the Llder Hall residential. (30 pupils in 2016)
