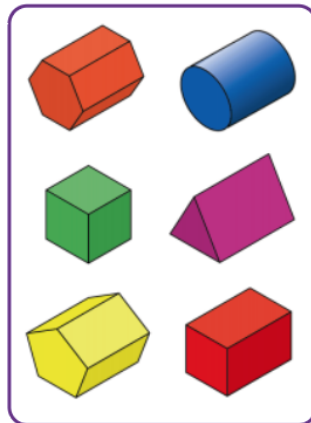
Maths
